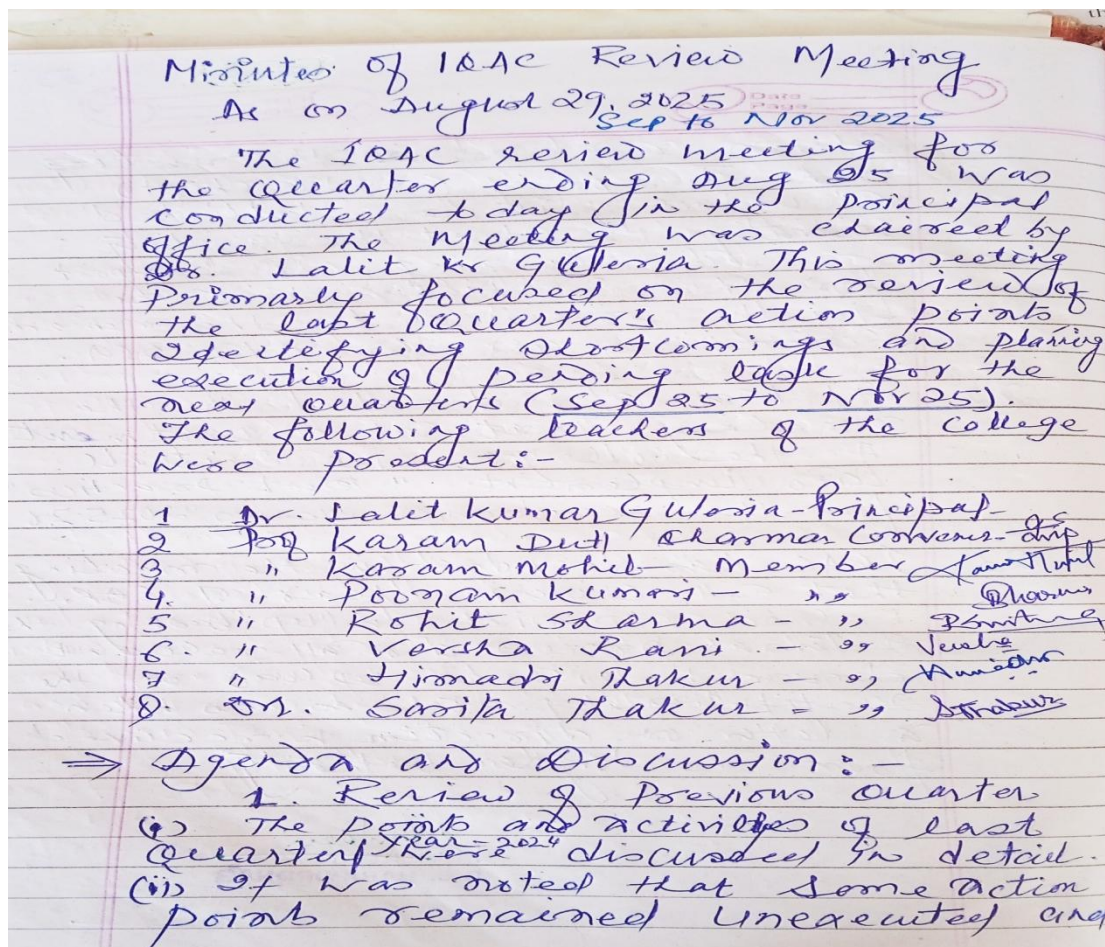

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Annual Review Meeting Report

The Annual Review Meeting of Government Degree College, Haripurdhara was conducted on **29.08.2025** at the college premises under the chairmanship of the Principal, Dr. Lalit K Guleria. The primary objective of the meeting was to review the academic and extracurricular performance of the institution for the session 2024–2025 and to strategize for the upcoming academic session 2025–2026.

Proceeding of the Meeting:-

1. Review of Academic Performance of Students

- A detailed subject-wise review of students' academic performance was presented in the meeting. The overall academic results were found to be satisfactory, though certain subjects displayed comparatively lower performance levels, indicating areas that require academic attention.
- It was also noted that implementation of flipped and blended learning strategies lacked systematic documentation at the departmental level.
- The committee emphasized the need to move beyond traditional assessment models. While written exams remain important, the integration of quizzes, class tests, viva-voce, group discussions, and presentations was strongly encouraged.
- The meeting recognized the academic challenges faced by slow learners and compartment students and resolved to introduce structured support systems.
- Departments were encouraged to work toward increasing student enrollment by promoting the relevance and scope of their programs.

Suggestions for Academic Year 2025–2026:

- Departments must maintain proper documentation of innovative teaching practices, including dates, time slots, mode of instruction, and learning outcomes.
- Remedial classes are to be organized on a regular basis for slow learners to ensure academic improvement and retention.
- Develop a standardized format for documenting flipped/blended classes.
- Organize quarterly performance reviews for continuous monitoring and timely interventions.
- Organize remedial and bridge courses for the students.
- Appoint faculty mentors to monitor and guide academically weaker students.
- Establish weekly tutorial hours in every department for personalized support.
- Faculty were advised to conduct career-oriented orientation sessions for prospective students.
- Initiatives like community outreach, open house programs, and school-college linkages were discussed. Collaborate with local schools and NGOs to raise awareness about college offerings.
- It was resolved that **special** academic support measures be implemented for students with learning difficulties and those appearing for compartment exams, to help them improve performance and achieve academic success.

2. Review of Co-curricular Activities:-

- The college successfully organized a wide range of co-curricular activities aimed at enhancing students' communication skills, creativity, leadership qualities, and general awareness.
- Events conducted included:
 - Cultural Programs showcasing regional art, music, and dance
 - Debates Competitions to foster public speaking and critical thinking
 - Essay Writing and Slogan Competitions on themes like environmental awareness, road safety and women empowerment.

- Organize blood donation camps, health awareness drives, and voter awareness campaigns under NSS.
3. **Strengthening MoUs and Collaborations**
 - Formalize at least 3–5 MoUs with reputed training centers, NGOs, or corporate partners.
 - Leverage these partnerships to conduct career-oriented workshops, soft skill training, and entrepreneurship awareness sessions.
 4. **Structured Coaching for Competitive Exams**
 - Recognizing the aspirations of students preparing for competitive examinations, the college will try to introduce coaching program.
 - The proposed coaching program will include:
 1. Expert lectures
 2. Study material support
 3. Interactive sessions and mock tests
 - This initiative is expected to encourage students to pursue careers in public administration and governance.
 5. **Annual Youth Festival / Talent Hunt**
 - The college will actively motivate and encourage students to participate in the Annual Youth Festival and Talent Hunt organized by the university. These events serve as vital platforms for students to showcase their talents in areas such as music, dance, dramatics etc.
 - To ensure inclusive participation, the college will promote both competitive and non-competitive categories, allowing a wider range of students to explore and express their creative abilities. Faculty coordinators will be assigned to identify and mentor talented students, and necessary support will be provided for rehearsals, costumes, and logistics.
 6. **Digital Participation and Awareness**
 - Encourage student involvement in online contests, virtual campaigns, and e-awareness drives related to national missions (e.g., Digital India, Fit India, Swachh Bharat).

4. Review of Sports Activities (2024–2025)

- Students actively participated in various indoor and outdoor sports events, including:
 - Volleyball
 - Badminton
 - Table Tennis
 - Athletics
 - Chess
 - Carom Board
- The participation of students in intra-college sports events was commendable.
- Outstanding performers were acknowledged.
- Despite the enthusiasm and potential demonstrated by students, the committee noted the inadequacy of sports infrastructure and equipment, which limited the scale and frequency of sports activities.

The Principal stressed the importance of regular physical activity in students' lives and highlighted the role of sports in developing teamwork, leadership, discipline, and personality.

Suggestions and Recommendations for 2025–2026

To further enhance the sports culture in the institution, the following suggestions were made:

1. **Improvement of Sports Infrastructure**
 - Proposals will be prepared and submitted for upgrading existing facilities and acquiring essential sports equipment.
 - Efforts will be made to develop outdoor playing fields, a multipurpose sports area, and a dedicated indoor games space.
2. **Organization of Inter-departmental and Inter-college Events**
 - The college will organize regular inter-departmental tournaments to ensure greater student engagement in sports throughout the academic year.
 - Students will also be encouraged and supported to participate in university-level inter-college competitions.
3. **Formation of College Sports Committee**

- Poster-Making and Quiz Contests conducted across various departments
- Active participation in state-level events, notably:
 - Hindi Pakhwada at Himachal Pradesh University on 14.09.2024, where cc students performed commendably
- Observance of significant days such as International Women's Day, World Environment NSS Day, etc., through relevant student-led programs.

The committee appreciated the enthusiastic participation of students and the efforts of faculty coordinators in planning and executing these events despite limited resources.

Suggestions and Recommendations for 2025–2026:-

To further enrich the co-curricular landscape of the college, the following suggestions were made:

- **Introduction of Thematic Weeks and Observances:-** Organize theme-based weeks such as Literature Week, Science and Innovation Week, Gender Sensitization Week, etc., to promote interdisciplinary learning.
- **Formation of Student Clubs and Societies:-** Establish dedicated **student-led clubs** like Literary Club etc. under faculty mentorship for regular and structured activities.
- **Inter-departmental Competitions:-** Conduct regular inter-departmental events to promote healthy competition and peer learning among students.
- **Community-Linked Activities:-** Involve students in **awareness drives** and **field visits** related to social and environmental issues, in collaboration with NSS/NCC and local bodies.
- **Collaboration with Other Institutions:-** Initiate inter-college collaborations and **joint cultural and academic events** to broaden exposure and exchange ideas.
- **Annual College Magazine and Newsletter:-** Initiate the publication of a **quarterly newsletter** to document student contributions, creative writing, and achievements.

3. Review of Extra-curricular Activities (2024–2025)

- **NSS and Community Outreach Programs:-** The NSS Unit of the college carried out several impactful activities throughout the year. Notable events included the celebration of NSS Day, National Sports Day, World Environment Day etc. Students actively participated in cleanliness drives, awareness campaigns, tree plantation, and community outreach efforts. The committee appreciated the commitment of NSS volunteers and program officers.
- **NCC (National Cadet Corps):-** It was noted that NCC enrollment had been suspended due to low participation in previous years. With the growing student population, the college expressed intent to revive NCC activities, pending necessary approvals from North Command Chandigarh and 1st Battalion Nahan.
- **MoUs with Government and Private Agencies:-** The college successfully initiated discussions with various external organizations to enhance the practical exposure and skill development of students. The committee emphasized the importance of formalizing MoUs with agencies for Skill-based workshops and Career guidance sessions etc. Such collaborations are seen as essential for bridging the gap between academics and employability.
- **Coaching for HAS and Allied Services:-** It was noted that no formal coaching was provided to students during the Academic Session 2024–2025 for competitive examinations. Recognizing the growing interest and potential among students in pursuing careers in public administration and government services, the committee decided to initiate a structured coaching program in the upcoming academic year 2025-2026.

Suggestions and Recommendations for 2025–2026

To further strengthen the extra-curricular ecosystem in the upcoming session, the following suggestions were made:

1. **Revival of NCC Activities**
 - Proactively follow up with NCC authorities for approval and begin fresh enrollment.
 - Assign a dedicated NCC Officer/Coordinator to manage operations once approval is granted.
2. **Expanded NSS Engagement**
 - Increase the number and variety of community outreach programs, especially in nearby rural areas.

- A Sports Committee comprising faculty and student representatives will be formed to plan, coordinate, and oversee all sports-related activities.
4. **Annual Sports Meet**
 - The college will organize an Annual Sports Meet to celebrate athleticism and recognize talent across various sports disciplines.
 5. **Collaboration with Local Sports Bodies**
 - Efforts will be made to collaborate with local sports organizations and district-level sports authorities for technical support, coaching, and equipment sharing.
 6. **Special Coaching for Talented Athletes**
 - Identified talented students will be provided with specialized coaching and mentoring to prepare them for competitive events at university and state levels.

5. Review of Infrastructure Development (2024–2025)

1. **Canteen Facility**
 - It was noted that the absence of an on-campus canteen is a major concern for students and staff.
2. **Multipurpose Hall Construction**
 - The construction of the Multipurpose Hall is underway.
 - Out of the total budget of ₹1.1 crore, ₹70 lakh has already been utilized.
 - A proposal for additional ₹40 lakh will be submitted to the government to complete the project, which is intended to serve as a venue for academic, cultural, and sports events.
3. **Involvement of Parent-Teacher Association (PTA)**
 - The PTA will play a more active role in infrastructure planning and resource mobilization.
 - The committee emphasized that PTA involvement will help address infrastructure gaps and foster greater stakeholder engagement.
4. **MoUs for Academic and Industrial Collaboration**
 - The college has taken preliminary steps to sign new MoUs with government departments, private industries, and academic institutions.
 - These partnerships will facilitate internships, research exposure and skill development programs for students.
5. **Capacity Building through Life Skills**
 - A structured plan is in place to conduct life skills sessions for students.
 - These sessions will focus on:
 1. Communication skills
 2. Critical thinking and problem-solving
 3. Time and stress management
 4. Financial literacy
 5. Interpersonal relationship building

Such initiatives are aimed at preparing students for both personal and professional challenges.

Suggestions and Recommendations for 2025–2026

To accelerate infrastructure development and ensure a conducive academic environment, the following action points were recommended:

1. **Enhanced Digital Infrastructure**
 - Improve campus Wi-Fi, install more smart classrooms, and upgrade ICT tools to support blended and digital learning.
2. **Proposal for Establishment of a Digital Library**
 - The college proposes to establish a Digital Library in the upcoming academic session 2025–2026. This facility aims to provide students and faculty with seamless access to e-books, academic journals, online databases, and learning platforms, thereby enhancing the overall

- Allocate a specific budget for the maintenance of existing infrastructure, including classrooms, furniture, sanitation facilities, and laboratories.
- 5. **Strengthening Industry-Academia Interface**
 - Actively pursue more MoUs with local industries, training centres, and research institutions to create career-oriented pathways for students.

Conclusion:-

The Annual Review Meeting concluded with appreciation of the progress made during the session 2024–2025. At the same time, weaknesses in certain areas were identified, and constructive suggestions were provided. The meeting resolved to strengthen academic support for students, enhance co-curricular and extracurricular engagement, and provide better opportunities in sports for holistic development in the upcoming session 2025–2026.
